

SCHOOL FEES

- School Fees for the year is collected in four instalments as follows : For April – May – June: On or by 10th day of April (or as notified separately) For July – Aug – Sept : On or by 10th day of July For Oct – Nov – Dec : On or by 10th day of Oct For Jan – Feb – Mar : On or by 10th day of Jan
- 2) Admission is granted on the specific condition that the guardian undertakes to pay all applicable fees and charges, as existing or revised, by stipulated dates. Fine will be imposed for payment beyond the last date stipulated. No separate reminder for timely payment shall be issued by the school.
- 3) Fees have to be paid ONLY BY ONLINE MODE the procedural details for which shall appear in the school website. Fee bills shall be available online during 1st to 10th of every quarter (or such other period notified separately). For the purpose, parent's mobile number should be registered with the school.
- 4) In case of serious difficulties in making online payment within stipulated time, Fees <u>can by</u> <u>exception be deposited only at the School Office</u> for an individual student by crossed A/c Payee DD for 1st Quarter and by DD / Cheque (*excepting post-dated / outstation / non-CTS Cheques or cheque bearing any alteration*) for any other Quarter. DD/Cheque should be drawn in favour of "LAKSHMIPAT SINGHANIA ACADEMY". On the reverse of the instrument, the guardian must mention Admission No., Name, Class & Section of the pupil. Appropriate Deposit slip shall be provided at the School counter.

It may be noted that school fees cannot be paid in cash at any receiving point.

- 5) Fee structure appearing in the school website relate to the particular session as existing and are subject to upward revision from time to time.
- 6) Items of fees payable yearly are payable at the beginning of the session and no part of it is refundable even if the pupil leaves before the end of the session.
- 7) Before a student is withdrawn from the school at any time prior to completion of Class XII, a written notice of withdrawal, signed by both the parents, must be given three calendar months in advance or else, fee in lieu thereof must be paid. In case not so paid, security deposit in respect of the student shall get appropriated to the extent possible.
- 8) <u>Fine for late payment</u>: If fee for a Quarter is not paid by the 10^{th**} day of the first month of the Quarter, late payment charge would be levied as per the following schedule :
 - a) From 11^{th**} to 20^{th**} of the month Rs.500/-
 - b) From 21st** of the month to 10th** of the next month Rs.1000/-
 - ** However if the 10th/20th is a holiday, payment can be made on the following working day in case of offline payment. Further, separate Circular may be issued from time to time for any particular Quarter.

9 A) The School shall not be able to bear with Fees falling in arrear for 30 days (10 days + 20 days as mentioned above) in respect of any student and his / her name will be liable to be struck off the rolls without any prior intimation. Re - admission in such cases may be granted only at the discretion and with the permission of the school authorities. Apart from clearing of all dues in arrear, a Re-admission fee of Rs.5000/- will be required to be paid.

9 B) Unless all dues are cleared in respect of a student, his / her Report Card and Transfer Certificate shall not be issued. Further, such a student shall not be allowed to appear in the School and Board Examinations.

9 C) While payment by cheque is not encouraged, in case a cheque is returned unpaid by the Bank for any reason whatsoever :



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(a) Payment in lieu thereof will have to be made in accordance with the applicable schedule of late fine and re-admission fee, depending on the date the school office receives the replacement payment. It shall be the endeavour of the school to intimate the guardian at the earliest after an incident of cheque dishonour or return comes to its knowledge from the bank. However, the school shall not own any responsibility at all for any delay in such intimation or for any matter in connection with the dishonour / return of the cheque. Nor shall the School be responsible for any apparent defect in the cheque existing at the time of receiving the same.

(b) In addition, for each dishonoured or returned cheque, an amount of Rs.500/- will be levied apart from possible permanent withdrawal of cheque facility.

10) A Parent may be required to produce fee payment records whenever required by the school.

11) Rules and regulations are subject to change from time to time as may be deemed necessary by the school authority. Separate circulars may be issued to suit particular occasions.

Note : For any correspondence with the school, Admission No. of the student must be quoted.

GENERAL RULES AND CODE OF CONDUCT : DISCIPLINE

1) Students must be properly groomed and should turn out in neat school uniform. Boys must have a decent haircut and clean shaven faces. Eccentric haircuts are not acceptable and may call for strict action. Sikh Boys must wear blue coloured 'Patka' with regular uniform and white coloured 'Patka' with P.E. uniform. Girls must have their hair plaited (if long). Only black bands to be used. Girls are not permitted to wear jewellery or apply mehndi. Girls of classes III-V must wear knee length skirts.

2) Students reporting to school for any reason must always come in proper school uniform. Students not in uniform will not be attended to. Students must wear their Identity Card at all times in school, while coming to or leaving school and carry the Academic Planner daily to school.

3) Students are required to be ready with their text and exercise books for their respective subjects every working day, unless otherwise specified.

4) While representing the school, students must be neat in their appearance and be in school uniform. No student can attend any inter school competition without the Principal's permission.

5) Students must not loiter in school uniform during school hours in cinema halls, shopping malls, or any public place, unless authorised.

6) Missing a class/ classes without the knowledge and/ or prior permission of the teacher concerned or competent authority will call for stringent action.

7) Students are not permitted to bring excessive money, or any expensive article or electronic gadgets to school. If found, it will be confiscated and may be returned at the end of the academic session subject to the discretion of the Principal. The school is not responsible for the exchange, loss or theft of personal belongings. It is inadvisable for students to bring valuables to school.

8) Only students of classes XI and XII may bring mobile phones if required and deposit with the HRT until dispersal.



9) Students must not disfigure school walls and property / furniture. Any damage caused to the above will subsequently result in fines being levied against those responsible.

10) All books to be returned to the library before commencement of major examinations / vacations. Fines will be levied for late submission and/or mishandling of library books.

11) Arrival beyond the reporting time will be considered as late arrival. For every three late arrivals, one day's absence will be marked in the attendance register. If late arrivals are more frequent, temporary suspension will be given. **Habitual late coming will be dealt with strictly.** The student may be asked to stay back after school hours or sent back home.

12) Students are expected to be courteous and respectful towards the school and school authorities, including teachers, peers and other ancillary staff members. Any misconduct in this regard will be dealt with firmly.

13) Bullying in any form will not be tolerated and strict measures will be taken against the offender. Student may be suspended for the same.

14) Violation of any code of conduct, disobedience or any behaviour subversive of good discipline in the school which is deemed inappropriate by the school authorities will lead to two written warnings, suspension and finally expulsion.

15) Marks / grades have been allotted for discipline in each term for students. The same will be reflected in the scholastic performance in the report card.

NOTE TO PARENTS :

- 1) Parents are advised to visit the school website www.lsakolkata.com regularly for information updates regarding all school matters.
- 2) Parents/ Guardians are required to notify the school authorities in writing regarding any change in address or telephone numbers.
- All newly admitted students should submit the Transfer Certificate and Migration Certificate (if applicable) to the school within one month of joining.
- 4) A letter stating the reasons must be sent if the student comes to school in irregular uniform.
- 5) **The Academic Planner should be regularly checked** for any messages/ notes from teachers and for any circulars issued by the school.
- 6) Student's notebooks must be periodically checked in order to be aware of their performance and progress. Signature of parents to be put where asked for by the teachers.
- 7) Research based Open Book Projects are given to students of Montessori and above. Attendance on the first and last day after and before each vacation is mandatory or the Open Book Project stands cancelled. These projects are of significant importance in the school's academic programme.



8) No permission will be given to any student to leave school during class hours unless there is an emergency in the family.

- 9) Open House meetings are held at regular intervals in the school (offline/ online). Parents are advised to meet the concerned HRTs and subject teachers to discuss about their ward's progress. Request for an alternate date and time may be made to the HRT. On other days, meetings with teachers are possible by taking prior appointments.
- 10) Please **DO NOT CALL** the school / teachers on days when there is heavy rain, suspension of public transport or any other such issues. **The school will remain functional either online or offline and shall be notified.**
- 11) Parents must submit the medical history and notify the infirmary incharge if their ward suffers from any allergy or chronic ailments.
- 12) In case a student gets hurt / falls sick in school, first aid will be administered and parents / guardians will be informed. However, in case this is not possible, the school authorities will take the necessary remedial measures.
- 13) If any medicine needs to be administered to a student during school hours, the parent must send the doctor's prescription along with a letter stating consent for the same.
- 14) School shall decide the participation of students in annual events/ other activities, and parental co-operation is solicited.
- 15) Every pupil is expected to contribute from time to time a small amount towards school related activities / functions, religious functions and social work as needed.
- 16) Students will undergo mandatory annual health check ups.
- 17) The role of parents cannot be over-emphasized and it is only expected that they take a positive view of the all-round effort of the school and its teachers and other staff members for the benefit of one and all. Parents need to be rational in their responses and dealings, such that the congenial atmosphere and sanctity of the institution is maintained. Any constructive suggestion, or even complaint, from the parents shall be addressed by the school authorities with concern in ways deemed by it as appropriate. Complaint forms are available at the front office.
- 18) Parents must abstain from discussing school matters on whatsapp or other social media. Any derogatory remark against the school or the faculty will be dealt with severity. It may call for suspension or expulsion of the student from school.
- **19)** Students can take remedial help from teachers beyond school hours (in online / offline mode) if they find it difficult to comprehend any topic.



LEAVE RULES

- 1) A minimum of 85% attendance per term is mandatory.
- 2) All messages regarding leave (for offline or online classes) must be sent from the parents' official mobile numbers or email ids.
- 3) The reason for absence up to two days must be clearly stated through an email to the HRT.
- 4) In case of absence for more than two days, an email should be sent to the school id addressed to the Principal. Anticipated time of absence should be mentioned in the mail.
- 5) A scanned copy of the medical certificate for a prolonged absence, owing to medical grounds should be mailed along with the leave application.
- 6) Students afflicted with infectious diseases or exposed to such diseases in their homes must complete the quarantine period before rejoining school. When the student rejoins school, the medical certificate with the doctor's Reg. No. stating the child to be free from infection and fit to resume classes, must be mailed to the school.
- 7) Appointments with doctors or others to be avoided during school hours.
- 8) Ailing students should not be sent to school. There is no provision for half day leave or retests.
- 9) If a student has to leave school before 10 am due to some emergency, the student shall be marked absent for the day.
- 10)No leave will be ordinarily granted for the first and last days of a term and / or extension of vacations.
- 11)Leave for attending weddings or religious functions will not be granted.
- 12)A student's absence for more than twenty days from online classes without prior intimation may result in the student's name being removed from the rolls.
- 13)A student without sanctioned leave will not be allowed to attend online classes till the Principal / Headmistress gives permission.
- 14) If a student is absent in any one of the online classes of the day or during the assembly, the student shall be marked absent for the day.

EXAMINATIONS :

- 1) Use of unfair means and / or possession of unauthorized material during any examination will result in the cancellation of the examination paper or the entire examination. A student who renders unfair assistance to another is equally culpable and will therefore share in the punishment. The grant of permission for reappearing in the examination rests with the principal. Repetition of such an offence will call for suspension or expulsion from the school.
- 2) During examination all students must carry transparent pencil pouches only. No writing boards, smart watches, mobile phones, food items are allowed in the examination hall.

PROMOTIONS :

 Promotions are decided on the student's cumulative performance over the year along with other factors that are observed about the child.



- 2) Due weightage is given to curricular and co-curricular areas and discipline.
- 3) A student who fails to secure promotion for the second consecutive year will have to be withdrawn.
- 4) Promotion will depend on an aggregate of 40% marks secured over the year in all the assessments.
- 5) A minimum of 85% of the yearly attendance is a pre-requisite for promotion.

EDUCATIONAL TRIPS :

These are an essential part of the curriculum. They are organized at least twice a year. All students should attend at least one trip. These trips enable the children to foster friendship, inculcate responsibility besides promoting awareness. While we encourage participation in these optional trips for holistic development of the student and take reasonable care, all concerned factors are not under the control of the school and the school is not responsible for anything untoward during and in connection with such educational trips.

HOUSE SYSTEM :

Students from class I onwards belong to the four Houses - VAYU, AGNI, JAL and PRITHVI with yellow, red, blue, and green colours allotted to each House respectively. The House system enables the students to become responsible members of the community through participation in games and other intramural activities.

CAFETERIA:

All students should bring nutritious tiffin to school. Light refreshments during breaks are available on payment through coupons in the school cafeteria.

BOOKSTORE :

The in-house bookstore caters to all textbooks, notebooks, worksheets, files, stationery and other educational materials required by students. All worksheets and notebooks should be procured only from the bookstore.

COMMUNICATOR / SPECIAL EDUCATOR :

Guidance and counselling is an integral part of the curriculum. We have qualified communicators and special educators for students who require help.

HONOURS:

Prizes are awarded for excellence in studies, games and other co-curricular activities. Due recognition is also given for exemplary behaviour, conduct and values. Students with 100% attendance and those with regular reading, writing or oratory skills are also applauded and recognized for their efforts.

BIRTHDAYS:

Students upto class V are allowed to come in decent coloured clothes on birthdays. Parents may, if they desire, celebrate the birthday of the child by giving books or plants as gifts. No gift should exceed ₹ 40/-. No eatables or cakes are allowed.



SCHOOL SAFETY RULES :

Our prime concern in the school is to ensure safety and security of our students and staff.

- 1) Be vigilant at all times and render assistance whenever required.
- 2) 24x7 CCTV surveillance is available (covering the entire
- periphery of the school, playgrounds, classrooms).
- 3) Students must wear their identity card at all times in school and while representing the school in any event. Escort Cards are mandatory for dispersal of students upto class VIII. In the absence of an Escort Card, the parent/guardian must send a mail authorizing the concerned person to collect the student or fill up a declaration available with the Administrative Officer.
- 4) In case parents would like to issue an Escort Card for themselves for dispersal beyond school hours, they may pay for the same separately and obtain one.
- 5) It is the responsibility of the parents to pick up their wards within half an hour after dispersal.
- 6) No student is to leave the school campus nor any parent / guardian is allowed to meet their ward during school hours without the Principal's permission.
- 7) Tiffin boxes, exercise books or other materials sent for students will not be handed over to them during the school hours for security reasons.
- 8) All must participate actively in disaster management drills that are conducted round the year in order to equip everyone to handle emergency situations.
- 9) Be familiar with the general layout of the school premises. Be aware of the evacuation plan, emergency phone numbers and assembly point areas.
- 10) Report all accidents/incidents immediately to the Infirmary Incharge/ Administrative Officer.
- 11) Every floor has trained attendants.
- 12) Respect each other and be tolerant of other's differences. Any form of misconduct will call for strict action.
- 13) Report any hazards that you may identify in the school. Never dismiss anything as trivial.
- 14) All safety protocols for COVID are being followed in the school.

THE COVID PROTOCOL

FOR STUDENTS -

- Students will report to school as per the roster for their class.
- Students to wear a N 95 mask while moving out of the house as a protection during commute and continue to wear the same till they return home from school. Must carry some extra masks to school.
- Students to wear a fresh set of uniform everyday including socks and ensure that the school shoes are sanitized every day
- Students to sanitize their bags before coming to school and preferably use the same bag every day.
- Sharing of tiffin and stationery with friends are not allowed. Cafeteria will remain closed.
- Students to sanitize their hands before and after using the washroom.
- Students to wipe their table tops with disinfectant wipes before class starts, before lunch and at the end of the day.
- Respiratory etiquettes to be followed by every student.
- Students to carry tissue papers in their bags and use it for coughing/ sneezing.
- Covid related trash to be put in pedal push bins only.
- Students are to follow the code of conduct.
- Number of people in the elevators shall be restricted to only three, duly maintaining social distancing norms. Elevators to be used only during emergency situations according to the lift norms.
- Usage of toilets and urinals to be done sensibly.

FOR PARENTS -

- Parents to drop students off at a distance.
- Undertake passive screening for the child every day.
- Screen their ward for temperature before leaving for school.
- Ensure that their ward wears mask and carries hand sanitizer in their bags.
- Also ensure tissue papers are there in their bags to be used for coughing/ sneezing.
- Parents to encourage their wards to use sanitizer once they arrive at school. If a child experiences dry or irritated skin with the application of hand sanitizers, such students must use a suitable hand moisturizer or something similar. The students must carry their own sanitizers too.
- If your ward has any kind of illness, even if it is just a runny nose, they must not come to school. If your ward comes to school unwell, you will be asked to collect them.



In limiting the number of adults on the school campus, we encourage you to contact us via e-mail or telephone before visiting. If a face-to-face meeting is required, we request you to contact your ward's HRT to seek an appointment before coming to school.

BY SCHOOL FOR THE STUDENTS -

- The Administrative department monitors the 360 degree sanitization / fumigation process of the school premises.
- The floor wise cleaning plan is being monitored and inspected daily by the in charges.
- Thermal scanning will be done by our security staff at the time of entry into the school.
- The student's desk will be marked and students will be made to sit at the designated place every day.
- There will be a strong focus on ensuring good health and hygiene practices like hand washing and all will be regularly reminded to wash their hands with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Touch less hand-sanitizing stations have been placed at entrances and common areas like corridors, washrooms to promote regular hygiene practices among all.
- Door & windows will be kept open, AC will not be used in classrooms.
- All the display boards in school have been covered with plastic.
- All teachers will sanitize their hands before entering their class and carry their own chalk, duster, marking pens.
- Movement of students has been marked by paint and stickers.
- Marks are there on the staircase to prevent touching the handrail.
- ✤ A COVID isolation room has been created on the 2nd floor.
