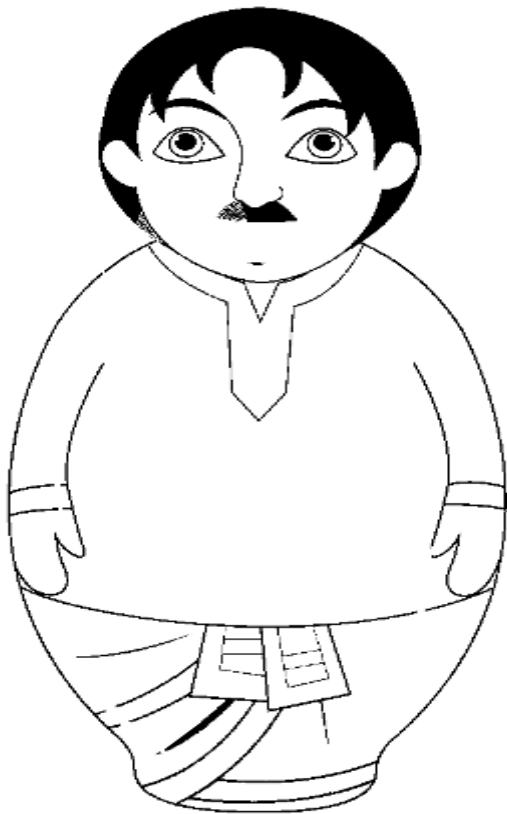

2. Paste cotton balls on the circles to complete the pot of rasgullas. Then colour the pot having more of them.

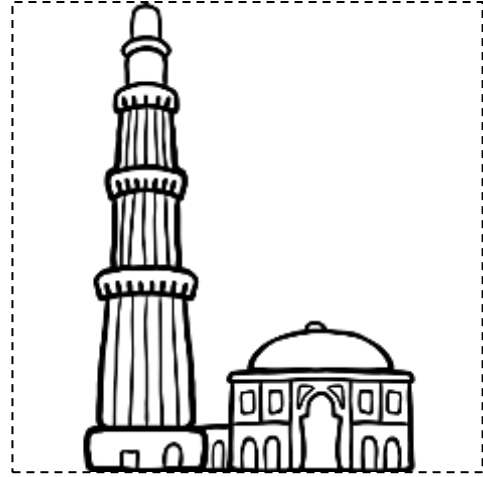
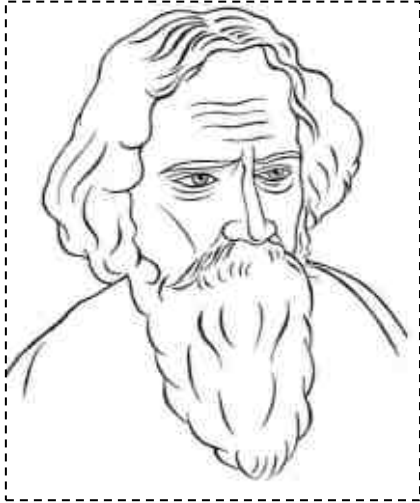


The sweet and syrupy rasgullas are the most famous sweet of West Bengal.

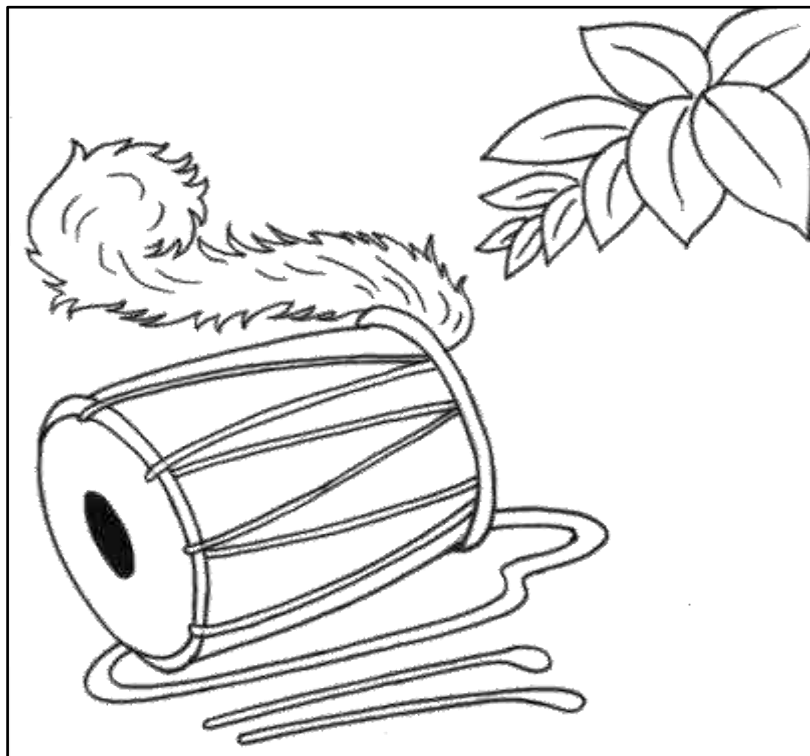


LEARNING OUTCOME:
